- 1) The Durham County Department of Public Health and Durham Diabetes Coalition are hosting a combined Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Culture of Health prize celebration and Take a Loved One to the Doctor event at the Durham County Human Services Building, Nov. 1, 10:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. This year's event will begin with a short Culture of Health prize celebration and feature fitness and cooking demonstrations, activities for kids, free screenings for asthma, blood pressure, diabetes, HIV and other sexually transmitted infections and a fresh produce giveaway from Veggie Van. A limited supply of free flu shots will be available to children eligible for the vaccines for children program.
- The FY2014-2015 Matching Grant Program of the Durham Open Space and Trails Commission application process will be from September 1 until November 14, 2014. The grants are to assist nonprofit organizations in preserving open space lands and promoting new or improved recreational opportunities for citizens. All Durham community nonprofits interested in applying for FY2014-15 Matching Grant funds must submit an application by the November 14, 2014 deadline. 4. Proclamation – Dysautonomia Awareness Month (5 min)

- 1) The Board is requested to proclaim October as Dysautonomia Awareness Month in Durham County.
- 2) Dysautonomia is an umbrella term used to describe a number of conditions caused by a malfunction of the autonomic nervous system. The autonomic nervous system controls all of the involuntary bodily functions that we normally take for granted—regulation of our blood pressure, heart rate, respiratory rate, digestion, kidney function, temperature control, pupil constriction and dilation, etc.
- 3) Ms. Connie Pruitt, the requester of the Proclamation, shared the story of her son who was diagnosed in 2012 with a form of Dysautonomia known as Postural Orthostatic Tachycardia Syndrome (POTS). POTS impacts 500,000- 3 million Americans, making POTS more common than well-known conditions like multiple sclerosis. The majority of people living with POTS are young women between ages 12 and 40, although older adults and males can be impacted too.

5. Proclamation – Take a Loved One to the Doctor Day (5 min)

- 1) The Board is requested to proclaim November 1, 2014 as Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Culture of Health and Take a Loved One to the Doctor Day in Durham County.
- 2) Durham County is one of six national winners of the 2014 RWJF Culture of Health Prize awarded by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation for its innovative strategies to improve health, including collaboration between organizations to increase access to medical care, coordinated planning to create a healthier environment and a focus on education and poverty in addition to disease as factors that impact health.
- 3) The Durham Diabetes Coalition collaborates with Durham County health and community organizations, faith-based groups, local government and universities and community members to reduce death and injury from type 2 diabetes. The Durham Diabetes Coalition and Partnership for a Healthy Durham in collaboration with Radio One Raleigh are hosting a combined RWJF Culture of Health Prize celebration and Take a Loved One to the Doctor event to encourage the public to get preventive health screenings and learn about available community resources.
- 4) Aligns with Goal 2 Health and Well-being for All: The Partnership for Healthy Durham and Durham Diabetes Coalition work towards strengthening the well-being of individuals and families through prevention, education, and partnering with community resources to increase access to health and wellness services.

8. <u>Public Hearing for the FY14-2015 Rural Operating Assistance Program Grant Application (10 min)</u>

1) The Board is requested to hold a public hearing on the FY15 Rural Operating Assistance Program (ROAP) Grant and approve submission of the grant application to the North Carolina Department of Transportation. The ROAP is a state-funded formula grant administered by the NCDOT-PTD. ACCESS, the Community Transportation Program within Cooperative Extension, is applying for the full allocation of the ROAP grant for Durham County. Grant Period is July 1, 2014 – June 30, 2015.

Elderly and Disabled Transportation Assistance Program (EDTAP) \$ 115,069
Employment Transportation Assistance Program (EMPL): \$ 35,860
Rural General Public Program (RGP): \$ 57,883
Total ROAP Grant: \$ 208,812

- 2) **EDTAP** funds will be used to provide transportation to the elderly, disabled and general public. No local match is required. **EMPL** funds will be used to provide work and work-related trips to transportation disadvantaged residents of the County. No local match is required. The Department of Social Services/Adult Services, Durham Center for Senior Life, ARC of the Triangle, Durham Exchange Club Industries and NC Services for the Blind partner with ACCESS to provide clients with transportation needs that comply with the grant requirements. Additional agencies may be added during the fiscal year. **RGP** funds will be used to provide transportation to residents of Durham County. RGP requires a 10% local match which will be collected through fares for the service (\$2.00).
- 3) Alignment with Strategic Plan: This requests aligns with Strategic Plan Goal 1 and Goal 2 by providing transportation to essential destinations that enhance the health, economic impact and quality of life for Durham County Residents.
