The Board is requested to authorize the County Manager to execute a contract for Design Consultant Services with Rooftop Systems Engineers, P.C. for the design and construction services for the Roof Replacement at the Detention Center in an amount not exceed \$102,500.00. The engineering firm will provide plans and specifications necessary for bidding and construction administration. Funds for this project are part of the \$1,500,000.00 Maintenance CIP budget for FY 2014-2015.

The General Services Department issued a Request for Qualification (RFQ NO. 15-011) for Architectural and Engineering Services for the Roof Replacement at the Durham County Detention Center. The objective was to enter into an agreement with an Engineer/Architect that has a proven track record in providing high quality engineering services to match the County's needs.

The RFQ was advertised on October 16, 2014 and statements of Qualifications were received on November 18, 2014. Six companies submitted proposals.

A review committee of selected County employees was charged with reviewing and ranking the proposals the committee selected the two most qualified companies and brought them in for an interview. Following the interviews, the committee selected Rooftop Systems Engineers, P.C. as the best qualified.

The source of these funds is 2007 voter approved General Obligation Bond funds. DTCC understands the importance of committing and expending these funds expeditiously. DTCC is not prepared to expend the Newton Building project funds at this time, however, it is prepared to expend additional funds in the Campus Improvement project to install a campus-wide emergency notification system, improve parking lot lighting on both the Main Campus and the Northern Durham Campus, upgrade the building control system and complete a new campus master plan.

In addition, DTCC acquired real property adjacent to the Main Campus in 2012 at a cost of \$1.8 million. DTCC requests the transfer of the remaining funds from the Main Campus Expansion Project because there is no further expansion of the Main Campus at this time.

General Fund. With the closing of the general ledger capital project fund, an approximate net equity of \$1,683 will be transferred to the General Fund.

This project supported repairs to Durham County homes for residents whose income was at or below 50% of the area median income. Durham County is a non-entitlement unit of local government and therefore does not receive regular CDBG funding. It is eligible, however, to apply for various CDBG grants. The County applied for and received Scattered Site Housing CDBG funds on a three year cycle to use for housing assistance for low-income homeowners, but the 2011 was the last of these grants and the NC Department of Commerce is shutting down this program.

Award of Contractor for Linen Services for Emergency Medical Services

Agenda Text:

The Board is requested to authorize the Manager to execute the contract with Angelica, with an office in Durham, NC, for linen and laundry services, in the annual amount of \$66,033.00 based on anticipated usage of 86,000 lbs.; and authorize the Manager to execute amendments within budgeted appropriations, if necessary, should the actual usage exceed 86,000 lbs. The contract amount for the remainder of this fiscal year, January 22, 2015 - June 30, 2015, will be \$33,000.00. A RFP process was performed by EMS through purchasing with only Angelica submitting a bid for EMS linen services.

Durham County Emergency Medical Services is the primary provider of ambulance service for Durham County, North Carolina and responds to approximately 36,000 requests for service annually. Linens are used in the transport of the patients to the hospital including sheets, towels, and blankets. EMS anticipated use per year is 86,000 lbs.

Budget Ordinance Amendment No. 15BCC000054 to Recognize Revenues from Public Health Medicaid Cost Settlement Funds to Replace the Tooth-Ferry Mobile Dental Unit

Agenda Text:

The Board is requested to approve Budget Ordinance Amendment No. 15BCC000054 for increased funding in the amount not to exceed \$475,000 for replacement of the Tooth-Ferry Mobile Dental Unit with the funding source of Public Health Medicaid Cost Settlement Funds received in the current fiscal year.

The Durham County Department of Public Health has been providing dental services to youth in Durham's public elementary schools for over a decade. Much of the work is completed aboard a specialized mobile treatment unit called the Tooth-Ferry. The unit is a 2000 Spartan Motorhome with a diesel engine. The Tooth-Ferry visits elementary schools with the highest number of free and reduced hot lunch recipients. Failure to prevent dental problems has long-term adverse effects that are consequential and costly. In particular, unchecked dental disease compromises children's ability to learn, to develop positive self-esteem, to eat and speak.

Since May, 2014, the Tooth-Ferry has spent an inordinate amount of time out-of-service for repairs. The major repair involved a cracked cylinder block. Due to the age of the vehicle, Advance Maintenance has anticipated additional repairs causing more out-of-service time over the following years. In the last 4 years, annual appointments have plummeted from 1,397 in FY 2012 to less than 300 as of February 2015.

The Board of Health has approved this amendment.

ALIGNMENT WITH STRATEGIC PLAN: This amendment aligns with Strategic Goal 2: Health and Well-being for All. Dental disease is one of the most prevalent chronic childhood diseases; yet it is entirely preventable.

Budget Ordinance Amendment No. 15BCC000053 - Recognize revenue to the Soil and Water Conservation Department from an EPA 319 grant administrated by the Division of Soil and Water, NC Department of Agriculture (NCDA)

Agenda Text:

The Board is requested to approve \$42,857 for Budget Ordinance Amendment No. 15BCC000053. This revenue was received by the Soil and Water Department through an Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) 319 grant. These funds were paid to the Soil and Water Department for gathering data and reporting the nitrogen applied to crops in Durham, Person, Orange and Granville Counties.

The Soil and Water Department requests that the BOCC allow part of these funds (\$27,716) to be used to purchase a cloud hosted land and water resource planning software called "Practice Keepers". Practice Keepers was created by Worldview Solutions and will enable the Soil and Water Department to develop a nutrient control strategy plan required by the state mandated watershed rules. Additionally, the software includes modules for tracking all of the department's data related to conservation plans, nutrient management plans, best management practices and agriculture as defined by the watershed rules. Moreover, this software could be utilized for urban nutrient management as well as other County departments making it a cross-departmental tool. Once the software is purchase by the Soil and Water Department the only cost for other departments to utilize the software would be a \$600/year/user fee. A demo is scheduled for City and County departments to review its capabilities and how it can assist each department with its responsibilities. The software has been reviewed by IT as well as the City-County GIS Department with both approving its compatibility while recognizing its benefits.

Additionally, the Soil and Water Department requests that the remaining grant revenue supports the purchase of a new vehicle (Chevrolet Equinox) to conduct departmental business. The department has one vehicle to support the daily travel for all Soil and Water efforts. On average, there are 35 site visits per week with over 10,100 miles logged per year. Of the miles logged, 5,500 are from personal vehicle usage.

Having an additional (fuel-efficient) new vehicle would save the County approximately \$2,000 with decreased gas costs and less personal mileage

reimbursement. In addition, it would reduce the number of times staff would have to drive personal vehicles to terrains that are not favorable for personal vehicle use. Most travel is to county citizen's property, with the majority of the issues dealing with erosion, drainage, or some other natural resource concern.

The total cost of the Chevrolet Equinox is \$20,000, of which \$15,141 is covered by the EPA 319 grant and the remaining amount funded from current year operating budget savings.

ALIGNMENT WITH STRATEGIC PLAN: The two requests align with Goal 4, Environmental Stewardship, by improving water quality, protecting open space, preserving rural character while changing behaviors to achieve environmental quality. Additionally, the request aligns with Goal 5, Accountable, Efficient and Visionary Government, by encouraging innovation while providing exceptional customer service.

Exposure to Ebola poses a real threat to North Carolina. Public Health Preparedness and Response has identified systematic approaches to strategically assist the public health authority with the reduction of threats, responsiveness to travelers' needs, and a response system to better protect those potentially exposed individuals and the state of North Carolina.

The Board of Health has approved this amendment.

ALIGNMENT WITH STRATEGIC PLAN: This aligns with Strategic Goal 2: Health and Well-being for All. It is imperative to deploy a response system that is able to respond quickly when symptoms of Ebola are detected in order to

protect the public.

## 15-383 Action Items Relating to Sidewalk Maintenance

#### Agenda Text:

The Board is requested to consider a number of action items relating to sidewalk maintenance and, if they deem it appropriate, to approve some or all of them.

The Board of County Commissioners has held three Worksession discussions on this issue, which originated with the question of whether the County should accept long-term maintenance responsibility for some small sections of sidewalk NCDOT is willing to build near the intersection of Randolph Rd. and Erwin Rd. Hence, the first potential action item would be to authorize the County Manager to execute such a maintenance agreement with NCDOT for those sections of sidewalk.

A second potential action item would be to adopt a simple sidewalk policy stating that the County will agree to enter into such sidewalk maintenance agreements only when NCDOT constructs the sidewalk, only when no other entity can reasonably take on maintenance, only within ½ mile of Durham Public School property, and only when the additional sidewalk offers important new pedestrian connectivity.

A third potential action item would be to discuss, modify, and potentially approve the attached plan outlining steps the County might take, along with the appropriate partners, to move towards an equitable and more comprehensive plan for improved pedestrian connectivity throughout Durham County.

One additional piece of information included in this item is a letter from NCDOT staff outlining the potential construction schedule for the proposed intersection signalization and improvements at the corner of Erwin and Randolph.

ALIGNMENT WITH STRATEGIC PLAN: Improved pedestrian connectivity relates closely to Strategic Plan goals 2 (Health), 3 (Safety), 4 (Environment) but also to Goal 1 (Community Prosperity) and 5 (Accountable,

Efficient, and Visionary Government).
