
"First, let me be clear, <u>Durham County does not currently spray for mosquitoes</u>. Secondly, <u>Durham has no localized transmissions of Zika virus spreading due</u> to mosquitoes. Facts on the table, things can change. In the event of localized transmission of Zika virus, isolated spraying is an option that will be considered by Durham County. This will mean spraying in a targeted area, using backpack sprayers, similar to those used by local mosquito control companies already operating in Durham."

- State apiary registration only covers aerial spraying, primarily used in agriculture settings. Durham is comprised mainly of backyard beekeepers.








Implementation

- Processed in house using a simple spreadsheet and GIS
- Outreach through DCBA meetings and listserv
