Durham juveniles are more likely to have multiple prior referrals than their statewide peers; 34% of them had a history of running away from							
home or placement; 27% needed substance abuse assessment and/or treatment; 77% of youth reported moderate to serious school behavior							
problems and 65% of youth assessed lacked positive peer interactions, with 20% associating with gang or member of gang.
