THE APPEAL PROCESS

<u>Informational Meetings</u>

*These meetings will provide the property owner an opportunity to speak with an appraiser to ask questions about the reappraisal process prior to filing a formal appeal. *To schedule an informational meeting with an appraiser, visit www.dconc.gov/taxhelp and select the "Unsure what to do?" button, or call (919) 560-0300.

*The location of the informational meetings will be at various library sites throughout Durham County.

*If you believe the appraised value is not a reasonable estimate of the January 1, 2019, value of your property, you can file a Formal Appeal.

Board of Equalization and Review Formal Appeals

*The revaluation notices will provide instructions on filing a form appeal.

*The Board of Equalization and Review will hear these appeals.

*There is a deadline for filing these appeals, so do not wait! You will not be able to appeal again until the following year.

*If you are not satisfied with the results of your appeal, additional legal remedies are

available.

The North Carolina Property Tax Commission

*Authorized to hear appeals from county boards of equalization and review.

*Notice of appeal must be in writing and filed within 30 days after the board has mailed notice of its decision.

*Hearings are conducted under the rules of evidence as practiced in the general courts of justice of the State.

The North Carolina Court of Appeals

*Appeals from Commission decisions are to the Court of Appeals.

*Appeals are based on the record made at the hearing.
