Summary Information:

- Durham County has had an increase in reported number of cases of salmonella, campylobacter, and other foodborne infections from 2017 to 2018.
- Sexually transmitted infections continue to represent the largest number of reportable communicable diseases in Durham County, with an increase in the number of early syphilis cases from 125 (2017) to 171 (2018).
- The CD program has had a 2-fold increase in the number of wild animal reports in 2018, but confirmed animal rabies cases decreased.

- The DCoDPH CD program has implemented several projects in collaboration with community partners to address syphilis, HIV and hepatitis C.
