Commissioner Reckhow moved, seconded by Commissioner Howerton to approve the January 27, 2020 Regular Session minutes.

Commissioner Reckhow had a comment on 20-0045, Commissioner Howerton had a comment on item 20-0065 and Chair Jacobs had a comment on items 20-0059 and 20-0066. Chair Jacobs had questions on items 20-0056 and 20-0049.

- Item 20-0045 Commissioner Reckhow thanked the Durham Open Space and Trails Commission for the four projects approved for the Durham County Matching Grants Program totaling \$76,700.
- Item 20-0065 Commissioner Howerton thanked staff for their research and commitment to opening a new Durham County Youth Home. Chair Jacobs asked if the design of the youth home accommodated transgender youth. Angela Nunn, Youth Home Director responded the youth home was designed for the safety of all youth.
- Item 20-0059 Chair Jacobs highlighted the amendment to the Durham Transit Tax Annual Work Plan was for an increase in funding to construct 10 bus stops and amenities for all 50 bus stops.
- Item 20-0066 Chair Jacobs thanked Andrew Miracle, Economic Development Officer for revisions to effectuate the Economic Development Incentive Policy.
- Item 20-0049 Chair Jacobs inquired about how closing projects and moving bonds funds for Durham Public Schools (DPS) would impact the funds allocated for Northern High School and Elementary School "C". Keith Lane, Director of Budget and Management replied closing seven DPS Capital Projects and moving funds to multiple new Capital Projects would not fundamentally change any funding for Northern High School and Elementary School "C".
- Item 19-0056 Chair Jacobs asked why the new Interlocal Agreements for the Durham Sports Commission were not on the February 3, 2020 Work Session agenda. Drew Cummings, Chief of Staff responded the new Interlocal Agreements were not completed in time to be added to the Work Session but was time sensitive with the current Interlocal Agreement expiring.

Chair Jacobs stated citizens requested to pull items 20-0032, 20-0037, 20-0042 and 20-0066.

Public Hearings

Public Hearing to Consider Allocating Economic Development Funds to Eli Lilly and Company

Andy Miracle, Economic Development Officer explained the Board was requested to hold a public hearing to consider allocating a total of \$2,550,000 in Economic Development funds to Eli Lilly and Company and authorize the Manager to enter into preliminary negotiations and execute an agreement with the Company. Eli Lilly and Company, a global healthcare and biopharmaceutical company, would build a new state-of-the-art pharmaceutical manufacturing facility in Durham County to help produce and develop medicines for people with serious illnesses; creating 462 jobs and investing \$440 million.

Chair Jacobs opened the public hearing.

Bryan Fox, Vice President of Public Policy, Greater Durham Chamber of Commerce expressed his excitement for Eli Lilly and Company to join the Durham community as a diverse employer, purchaser, major investor and corporate citizen.

C.J. Broderick, citizen expressed concern with Durham County having inclusive and equitable economic development. He added in two to five years employees working for Eli Lilly and Company would start to buy homes in Durham and displace current residents. Mr. Broderick asked was there a plan for the displaced residents in the area. Chair Jacobs asked Mr. Broderick to review the Economic Development Policy suggesting his participation and present it to the Board at a Budget Work Session.

Chair Jacobs closed the public hearing.

The Board thanked Eli Lilly and Company for following the draft Economic Development Policy and commended staff for the policy. The Board recommended promoting transportation management by having provisions to promote flex time, along with car and van pooling. The board asked how much the State committed to Eli Lilly and Company. Mr. Miracle responded \$5 million.

The Board stated Eli Lilly and Company was the first Fortune 200 company in Durham County. They highlighted the foundation was the second largest in the United States; also highlighting their Early Childhood investment stated and more than half of the 462 jobs would only require an associate degree or certification and pay \$50,000 or above.

Commissioner Reckhow moved, seconded by Commissioner Carter for County Manager Davis to enter into preliminary negotiations and execute an agreement allocating a total of \$2,550,000 in Economic funds to Eli Lilly and Company.

The motion carried unanimously

Directive: Commissioner Reckhow requested the County Manager Davis compose a letter to the Environmental Affairs Board (EAB) to review questions and issues for 300 and 500 Main Street. She requested the EAB to review policy changes, infrastructure changes, work schedules and other communities for best practices and provide report to Board.

Other Business

20-0053 Follow-Up on Commissioner Directives

Directives from previous meetings and staff follow-up were reviewed by the Board.

Directives:

- Peri Manns, Interim General Manager was asked to follow up with a previous directive the Board issued regarding parking options for 300 and 500 East Main Street. The Board requested Mr. Manns to have staff provide an update at the March 2, 2020 Work Session on the Transportation Demand Management and staff parking assessment.
- Commissioner Reckhow requested a report on the total amount spent on the discharged Engage Durham Consultant.
- County Manger Wendell Davis was asked to provide the Board with updates on the Sales Tax Interlocal Agreement.

20-0058 Resolution - Triangle Trails Initiative

Commissioner Reckhow stated she along with Chair Jacobs, County Manager Wendell Davis and Jane Korest, Open Space/Real Estate Manager had a meeting with Chuck Flank, President of Greenways Incorporated and Sig Hutchinson, Wake County Commissioner to discuss information about the Triangle Trails Initiative and how to include Durham County in the multi-county regional greenways and trails strategy. She added the initiative raised private funds and not public funds to complete the plan. Commissioner Reckhow stated the greenways and trails could be used for transportation and not just recreation for an economic boost and health. Chair Jacobs stated the trails could be one way to address change and congestion on the roads and recommended adding the following whereas to the resolution:

"Whereas, bike and pedestrian paths are necessary means for transportation to work and not just for recreation."

Commissioner Reckhow recommended to have the Triangle Trails Initiative work with Durham Open Space and Trails, Bicycle Pedestrian Advisory Committee, Bike Durham and public meetings. Commissioner Carter asked if the County would follow the blueprint for equitable engagement. Commissioner Reckhow responded it was not discussed but was a great point. Commissioner Howerton asked which County was designated as being responsible for the initiative. Commissioner Reckhow replied each County was responsible for their own greenways and trails. Commissioner Howerton expressed her concern regarding the essence of the initiative adding she was uncomfortable with voting in favor of the resolution.

Commissioner Carter moved, seconded by Commissioner Reckhow to approve the Triangle Trails Initiative Resolution with the addition of:

"Whereas, bike and pedestrian paths are necessary means for transportation to work and not just for recreation."

The motion carried 4-1 with the following vote:

Items Pulled from the Consent Agenda

Waldo Fenner, citizen stated he was thankful to hear a new youth home was being built, although he thought it was overdue and should have been built earlier. Commissioner Howerton explained that the delay was due to the County planning for funding and resources for the project. Vice Chair Hill interjected that the State was initially responsible, however the County took leadership with funding the project.
