The North Carolina Biotechnology Center (NCBiotech), headquartered in Research Triangle Park, has pursued its mission to accelerate life science technology-based economic development through innovation, commercialization, education, and business growth since 1984. NCBiotech's programs include grants that propel innovation at NC universities, loans enabling life science entrepreneurs to achieve critical commercial milestones, life science intelligence services supporting companies large and small, and networking events convening our life sciences community. As the home of NC Central and Duke University, life sciences incubators like BioLabs NC and First Flight Venture Center, and 270+ life sciences companies, the opportunities for partnership between Durham and NCBiotech are boundless.

NCBiotech's Economic Development Award (EDA) program is designed to support NC communities in attracting new life sciences jobs and investment. In 2018, NCBiotech and Durham County partnered through the EDA program to support Novartis Gene Therapies (NGT) plans to create 400 biopharma manufacturing jobs. AveXis utilized the EDA program to purchase key equipment for hands-on training for its new gene therapy manufacturing facility in Durham County. Furthermore, AveXis committed to donate \$45,000 of this equipment to Durham Tech Community College, strengthening the capabilities of the college to train future employees.

up to one million square feet of premier Class A office space

Begun as an experiment to lease office space to small businesses and startups in 2015, the Frontier building concept has been so successful that it is now considered a campus at Research Triangle Park. The expansion houses 100 companies—1/3 of the total in RTP—in an affordable, amenity and program packed innovation center.

Once complete, the community will be enhanced with the opening of Boxyard RTP to extend the creative culture of the Frontier campus to retail, food and beverage, all clustered around a programmable outdoor entertainment venue for concerts, lectures and fun – and dog friendly to boot!

AMERICAN TOBACCO CAMPUS

the largest historic renovation in the state



When we began the renovation of the American Tobacco Campus, we weren't sure if this project would be successful. Downtown Durham had serious challenges and no private developers were considering redevelopment here. But ATC has gone from a major risk to something we see as a generational project. American Tobacco is now the largest historic renovation project in the state at over 1 million square feet and home to companies like Burt's Bees, Avalara, and our nation's most diverse startup hub, American Underground. Our partnership with the County of Durham made this project possible and we're glad to call them partners.
