

**Durham County Juvenile Crime Prevention Council**  
**Request for Proposals FY 2021-2022/23**

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**The Durham County JCPC is requesting proposals for fiscal year 2021-2022/23:**

The JCPC has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Department of Public Safety (DPS) in the amount stated below to fund the program types specified. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the State Fiscal Year 2021-2022/23 beginning on, or after, July 1, 2021. The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council may recommend certain programs for one or two-year funding awards dependent upon program performance, compliance with JCPC policy, and the availability of state JCPC allocation funds. The use of the funds in Durham County requires a local match in the amount specified.

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**The JCPC will consider proposals for the following program types. Programs should be outcome-based, should be compatible with best-practice research, and should have the ability to identify, detect and address gang participation**

Vocational Skill Building	Restitution/Community Service	Emergency Shelter

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**Proposed program services should target the following concerns as reported in the Risk Factors and Needs Assessment for the 176 youth who were referred to juvenile court between July 1, 2019 and June 30, 2020.**

- 74% of youth at intake had mental health needs
  - 57% of youth at intake were reported to have serious school behavioral problems
  - 58% of youth at intake come from families with marginal or inadequate supervision skills
  - 57% of youth at intake had need for substance abuse assessment and/or treatment
  - 23% of youth at intake were reported to be gang members or associates
  - 47% of youth at intake had prior runaway history
  - 26% of youth at intake had 4 + previous referrals to juvenile intake
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**INSTRUCTIONS:**

- Local public agencies, 501(c) (3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities will be considered for funding. New applicants are required to attend an information session held at 326 East Main Street (date)
- In order to apply for FY 2021-2022/23 JCPC funding, you must register with NCID (instructions on the DPS website), complete and submit a JCPC Program Application online at <http://www.ncdps.gov/Index2.cfm?a=000003.002476.002483.002482.002514> Also available on the website is a Webinar Training Video and other DPS-DJJ Users Guide forms. Private non-profits are also required to submit the following forms online or your application will be considered incomplete: **1) No Over Due Tax form (available at the above link), 2) Notarized DPS Conflict of Interest Statement (available at the above link), 3) the agencies Conflict of Interest Policy; and 4) Proof of 501(c) (3) status.**

- Please note, while a 30% match is required, that matches provided can be inclusive of in-kind contribution

- All funded programs will be required to attend regular JCPC meetings/events and sponsored trainings.
