

Durham County Memorial Stadium will continue our phased reopening this week as we welcome back our third-party events into the stadium. The Stadium and our event organizers have been updating facility and event operations in accordance with the current state and local Interim Guidance for Indoor and Outdoor Venues for Live Performances (Outdoor Venue with Capacity Below 10,000). *Face Coverings, Social Distancing and Capacity Limitations are still required and will remain in effect under the current guidance for Outdoor Live Performance Venues within North Carolina Executive Order No. 209 (April 28, 2021).*

We understand that COVID-19 state and local guidance will change as our community continues to recover from the pandemic. We will update this space as our protocols change to reflect the current guidance. *COVID-19 protocols are in place for all patrons regardless of if the individual has received any or all their COVID-19 vaccination.*

- All persons entering the stadium are required to wear a two-ply cloth mask or face covering that covers both the mouth and nose.
 - Masks must be worn correctly at all times.
 - Masks are not required for children under 24 months of age.
 - o Gaiters, bandanas, and masks with valves or vents are not permitted.
 - The use of a face shield must be accompanied by a mask beneath the shield.
 - Masks may only be removed to actively consume food and beverage while in the guest's seating area.
 - If eating or drinking, remove your face covering, take a bite of your snack or drink of your beverage and please place your face covering back over your nose and mouth until you're ready for your next bite/drink.
- Facility capacity will follow the current guidance and will be posted at the entrance gates of the venue
- Patrons are to remain seated except when entering or exiting the seating area
 - We understand that there's a lot of excitement to support your participants, but this is a requirement of the current guidance
- Please maintain 6 feet (2 meters) of distancing throughout the seating areas and while walking the concourse
- Do not congregate on the concourse, walkways or immediately outside the facility gates
- Maximum Capacity inside the elevator is 2 people
- Press Box is for Event Organizers and Facility Staff Only.

- Wellness checks will occur at the entrance to be administered by staff of the event organizer
