  - **District Land** Eddie Culberson reported that he has received a couple of quotes for someone to mow the land.
  - **FY2022-2023 Budget Request-** new Soil & Water position request for FY2022-2023 was not approved. The department received \$75,000 in additional funding for the AED Grant and an increase in Travel and Training.
  - **TJCOG** is working with Durham County to assist departments with seeking grants and administering them.
  - RC&D- received \$100,000 in additional funding for a total of \$200,000. The funds will be used for projects in PCC communities.
  - Hydrilla- Started treatment on 6/27 (Orange Co to 15-501) in the Eno River.
  - **Drones** Criminals have been using drones to fly over Agricultural properties and steal equipment during the middle of the night.

#### G. Stream Restoration and Stormwater Projects – Eddie Culberson reported on the following:

- Grove Park Project
  - Waiting on flood plain permit from City. Will start construction as soon as we receive the permit
  - DWR Grant Extension- Received an extension until 3/31/2023.

• Marbrey/Jackson Project- Eddie Culberson reported that he received quotes to fence the easement where the ATVs are causing significant destruction to the stream restoration project. The quotes range from \$2,500 to \$3,000. Eddie has an appointment with a local contractor to get another quote. He plans to bring the quote back to the next meeting.

### • Riverside High School Project

- Engineers will be at Riverside HS tomorrow surveying the project.
- Will be discussing vegetation that the students will be growing and planting for the project.

# H. Ag Development/Farmland Protection Advisory Board- Sherry Scully reported the following: Agriculture Economic Development (AED) Grant Program

- The BOCC allocated \$150,000 to the FY 2023 Ag Economic Development Grant Program. This is an increase of \$75,000. Applications are being accepted through August 31<sup>st</sup> at 5pm. Please help us spread the word to those eligible for this opportunity.
- A special called meeting was held by the AED Grant Committee to determine new caps for the grant program. Farmer grants are now capped at \$7,500 and School grants at \$1,500.
- Two hybrid training sessions have been held with 13 participants in attendance. Thank you,
   David Harris for being a part of these sessions! The third training session is scheduled for July
   12<sup>th</sup> at the North Regional Library and online.

**Farmland Protection Advisory Board (FPAB)**- did not meet in June. Their next scheduled meeting is for July 21<sup>st</sup> at 6 pm in hybrid format from the Farm Bureau Bldg.

**USDA Grant**- a motion was made by David Harris for the board to write a letter of support for staff to apply for a USDA grant for funding to help pay for teachers and student interns for the BETC program. Mark DeWitt seconded the motion. A roll call was done, and all voted yes in favor of the motion. Motion carried

#### I. Environmental Education Report- Lisa Marochak reported on the following:

- Rain Barrels- Lisa will check with the city to see if they sell to County residents.
- **Resource Conservation Workshop (RCW)** Lisa announced the four HS students that the district sponsored to attend the 2022 Resource Conservation Workshop at NCSU have been asked to attend the August 1<sup>st</sup> board meeting to provide an update on the workshop.
- Ornaments for the White House Christmas Tree- A motion was made by David Harris to allow staff to purchase 12inch wood circles for students in Durham to make ornaments for the tree.
   Ken Browning seconded the motion. A roll call was done, and all voted yes in favor of the motion. Motion carried
- Contest- Lisa Marochak reported that the Education Committee for the NCASWCD voted to change the ages for the 2022-2023 Conservation Contests. A motion was made by Ken Browning to let the Environmental Education Coordinator add 2 additional contest awards to this year's contest. Mark DeWitt seconded the motion. A roll call was done, and all voted yes in favor of the motion. Motion carried
- J. NRCS Update- Diana Irizarry with NRCS provided an update to the board.

#### **Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP)**

• Applications for the Seasonal High Tunnel Initiative that were not funded thru EQIP Classic had been evaluated thru EQIP Urban Initiative.

- Six applications evaluated
- Only five applications were ranked. Those applications are in the NC Urban Priority Area.
- Total funding requested \$47,500
- One person interested to learn more about EQIP and Silvopasture
  - Meeting this Wednesday, the 13<sup>th</sup>

# **Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP)**

- One application for CSP for forestry-related conservation practices, prescribed burning, and tree planting.
  - The total amount of funding requested for this application is approximately \$22,000
  - The ranking deadline was extended to July 8<sup>th</sup>. So, we should know who gets selected for funding in the next week or so.

### **Conservation Reserve Program (CRP)**

- National accepted a CRP offer in Durham County. This land will be enrolled for CP2, Establishment of Native grasses and forbs.
- NRCS and the District 5 Wildlife Conservation Biologist will meet this Friday, the 18<sup>th</sup>, to develop a conservation plan.
- The CRP offer is for 13. 6 acres.

## **K. Regional Coordinator**- Brandy Myers – *Regional Coordinator*

- Provided an update to the board. A copy of the Regional Coordinator's report was emailed to the District Board prior to the meeting.
- L. Bahama Community Park update- David Harris reported that the Bahama Community Park Committee recommends for the District Board to deed the 48-acre property over to the Bahama Fire Department. The committee contact the County Attorney's office to see if they can help draw up an MOA between the district and the Bahama Fire Department.
