

August 2023 Announcement

The Durham Board of County Commissioners solicits applicants to fill positions on the following citizen boards and commissions:

- Adult Care Home Community Advisory Committee (18 At-Large Positions)
 - This committee's primary function is to maintain the rights of residents living in adult care homes including assisted living facilities and family care homes. They serve as the link between the community and the homes, seeking to increase community involvement and, at the same time, promoting community education and awareness of the needs of the residents in these homes.

<u>Special Requirements:</u> 6-24 hours per quarter, 15 hours of initial training before visits can begin, must complete 10 hours of annual training and must serve on a subcommittee. Miscellaneous: 1 hour per week responding to phone calls, emails and subcommittee meetings.

- Audit Oversight Committee (1 At-Large Position)
 - o Maintains the following functions and responsibilities: provides oversight responsibilities of the audit function; serves in an advisory capacity to the County Manager; facilitates communications among the Board of County Commissioners and County Manager; ensures internal controls are in place and implemented; ensures County management implements report recommendations; reviews annual audit plan and makes recommendation to County Commissioners for approval; reviews audit budget and makes recommendation to Board of County Commissioners for approval; works in concert with the Finance Director and the County Manager in making recommendations for the selection of the external auditor; reviews and approves the County's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report, management letter and other required communications.
- Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Commission (3 Positions: 1 At-Large, 1 "Bicycle Community," and 1 "Senior Advocacy" Position)
 - o Advises the Board of County Commissioners on questions relating to bicycle and pedestrian issues including bicycle commuting, urban trails and greenways, university students/university facilities, transportation planning/policy, recreation/recreation business and Inter-Neighborhood Council.
- Board of Adjustment (1 "County Resident" Position)
 - o Holds quasi-judicial public hearings to determine requests made by property owners in the City and County of Durham for minor and custodial care special use permits, variances and appeals of administrative interpretations or decision, as authorized by State law and local ordinance.

Special Requirements: Applicants must live outside of the city limits.

- City-County Appearance Commission (2 At-Large Positions)
 - o Tasked with enhancing and improving the visual quality and aesthetic character of Durham City and County. Its mission is to cultivate excellence in design, preservation and stewardship of the natural and built environment; to communicate the economic, social, and aesthetic value of good design and planning; and to celebrate exemplary design within the community.
- Community Child Protection/Child Fatality Prevention Team (6 Positions: 3 At-Large, 1 "Fireman or EMS Rep," 1 "Law Enforcement Officer," and 1 "(Parent of) Death of Child before 18" Position)
 - Promotes the development of a community-wide approach to the problems of child abuse and neglect and seeks ways to protect children from preventable deaths. The team reviews selected cases that are being serviced by child protective services and cases in which a child has died of suspected abuse or neglect.
- Dangerous Dog Appeal Board (1 "County Employee" Position)
 - O Designated as the board to hear all reviews and appeals authorized by the Durham County Animal Control Ordinance. The Dangerous Dog Appeal Board was established by the Board of County Commissioners, pursuant to General Statute 67-4.1(c) and is responsible for hearing the appeal of dog owners who have had their dogs declared dangerous or potentially dangerous.

- Durham County Women's Commission (2 At-Large Positions)
 - o Strives to educate the community and advise the Durham County Board of Commissioners as necessary on issues relating to the changing social and economic conditions of women in the County.
- Durham Planning Commission (1 "Triangle Township" Position)
 - o Reviews recommended plans, policies and reports of the professional planning staff and makes recommendations concerning them to the governing bodies, including rezoning and zoning ordinance changes.
- Environmental Affairs Board (1 "Youth (15-22)" Position)
 - o Provides to the City and County with expert and comprehensive advice on various matters related to environmental quality, environmental safety, equity, and environmental justice. The general purpose of the Board is to advise and assist the City and County on matters related to the maintenance and improvement of the quality, accessibility, and safety of the environment and its people.
- Homeless Services Advisory Committee (1 "Corporate/Private Sector")
 - Advises the Durham Board of County Commissioners and the Durham City Council on the implementation of collaborative initiatives to prevent and end homelessness in Durham.
- Industrial Facilities and Pollution Authority (1 At-Large Position)
 - Aids in the financing of industrial and manufacturing for the purpose of alleviating unemployment or raising below average manufacturing wages by financing facilities that provides job opportunities or provides better wages than those prevalent in the area.
- Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (2 Positions: 1 "Youth Under Age 18," and 1 "Substance Abuse Professional" Position)
 - Reviews the needs of Durham juveniles who are at risk of delinquency or who have been adjudicated, undisciplined, or delinquent, review and evaluate the resources available to address those needs, develop and implement a request for proposals process, and submit a written plan of action for the expenditure of juvenile sanction and prevention funds to the Durham Board of County Commissioners. Members do not directly interact with any juveniles.
- Nursing Home Community Advisory Committee (12 At-Large Positions)
 - o Responsive to the needs of nursing home residents and promotes community involvement and cooperation with nursing homes. Members must be County residents and have no financial interest (directly or indirectly) in a nursing home, and no immediate family of a resident can be on the committee.
 - **Special Requirements:** 6 hours of initial required official training; 1.5-6 hours required per month for committee meetings, nursing home visits and unofficial training. Requested to participate in various community events.
