
Durham County is one of the healthiest counties in North Carolina

County Health Rankings

- County Health Rankings and Roadmaps is a program from the University of Wisconsin Population Health Institutes
- Provides data, evidence, guidance, and examples of health data and equity
- Health Rankings use >30 measures to evaluate health outcomes and health factors



How to use these data

- Health disparities are identified by collecting data on race for the following health factors:
 - Low birth weight and infant mortality
 - Flu vaccinations
 - Child poverty
 - Drug overdose deaths
 - And more!
- Identifying these differences helps highlight areas of excellence and equity as well as areas for improvement

Reasons for disparities

- People of color have a history of limited access to healthcare and worse health outcomes than their White peers.
- Access to healthcare can be limited due lack of insurance from low paying jobs, immigration status as well as a mistrust of the medical system; all of which can be attributed to systemic racism.
- Systemic racism impacts all aspects of a person's life, especially health.






Race and Ethnicity of Durham County Compared to North Carolina 2022



Areas of excellence: Life expectancy

Durham County has a longer life expectancy (80.0 years) compared to North Carolina (77.7 years)





Blacks or African Americans have a lower life expectancy than other races and ethnicities. Toxic stress from systemic racism contributes to chronic disease and other health related issues.

Areas of Excellence: Mortality



Durham County has fewer premature deaths (6,400 deaths per 100,000 than North Carolina (8,000 deaths per 100,000)

Durham County has a lower infant mortality rate (6 per 100,000) than North Carolina (7 per 100,000)

Durham County has a lower suicide rate (8 per 100,000) than North Carolina (13 per 100,000


Areas of Excellence: Access to healthcare



- Durham county has one primary care provider for every 810 persons. North Carolina has one provider for every 1,410 persons
- Durham County has one mental health provider for every 140 persons. North Carolina has one mental health provider for every 340 persons

Durham County has a higher percentage of flu vaccinations than North Carolina




Flu Vaccinations in Durham County and North Carolina

Areas of Improvement

- Reduce racial disparities in all health factors to improve overall health outcomes
- Reduce the HIV and STI prevalence
- Reduce violent crime
- Reduce food insecurity
- Reduce drug overdose deaths
- Reduce the prevalence of uninsured adults and children
- Improve math and reading scores
- Reduce the number of homicides
