Official Rules - Posters: 3rd - 5th grades

- NO NAMES ON THE FRONT. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- Posters should be no larger than 24x36 inches. No exceptions!
- Posters must have the current theme incorporated into the poster, preferably as the header/poster title.
- Pictures or other materials may be mounted on the poster if mounted securely. Only materials that are flat or create a 2D effect may be used.
- Poster should be colored (any coloring materials may be used).
- Poster must be the original work of the student. Original work is created by the student and shows a fresh, new idea. Hand drawn pictures are preferred over computer generated.
- Posters should be submitted flat and not rolled.
- Posters must be identified on the back using the official registration form (see below).

- In order to insure impartiality in judging, personal information such as name, school, etc. shall not be stated during speech. Infractions will be taken during scoring for violation of this rule.
- No visual aids are allowed. Note cards should only be used as a backup.
- Complete scoring criteria and rubric are available upon request before the event.

Official Rules - Slide Show: 6th, 7th, 8th, and 9th - 12th Grades

- Max amount of slides allowed = 15 slides of content. Fewer slides are allowed.
- No identifying information (names, school info, etc.) should be located in the body of the slide show in order to ensure impartiality in judging.
- The slide immediately following the slide show (slide number 16 if 15 slides are used) should be blank. The slide immediately following the blank slide show (slide number 17 if 15 slides are used) should contain identifying information (detailed below). For example, the correct order for the slide show should be:
 - Slide show (up to 15 slides)
 - Blank slide (#16)
 - Entry Form Slide (#17)
- Slide shows must be created using Microsoft PowerPoint software. Files shall be saved so that they are compatible with PowerPoint 2003 (ppt file). Do not save as a pptx file.
- The use of audio is allowed
- The use of slide animation is allowed
- The use of video is prohibited. Shows using video will be disqualified.
- Slide shows shall not exceed a maximum of 5 minutes in length.
- Slide shows must be submitted electronically to Lmarochak@dconc.gov by the February 15, 2024 deadline.
- All slide shows will be judged electronically.
