

Who may participate?

Individuals with substance use issues who are convicted of certain non-violent felony, or misdemeanor offenses, and receive probation are eligible for drug court. Individuals who are identified as high-risk/high-need, already on probation, and whose supervision can be modified may also participate. Additionally, any individual eligible for an intermediate sanction may request program participation.



Program Requirements

- Comply with Probation
- Participate in the Recommended Level of Treatment
- Group Counseling
- Individual Counseling
- Frequent/Random Drug Testing
- Case Management
- Bi-Weekly Court Sessions

Adult Drug Treatment Court is supervised treatment opportunity which seeks to:

- Reduce drug dependency and alcoholism among participants.
- Reduce the revolving door of drug addiction and crime.
- Increase personal, family, and social accountability.
- Promote cooperation, coordination, and collaboration between the criminal justice system and community agencies.
