




Board of Elections Mission & Vision

Board of Elections Organizational Chart & Structure

- Training and Recruitment Manager Division: Responsible for precinct official training, precinct official recruitment and retention, website maintenance, social media, outreach, and other administrative tasks as assigned.
- Logistics Division: Responsible for inventory maintenance, supply management, warehouse management, general organization, records management, delivery and setup, emergency management, polling place procurement and maintenance, application development, and other administrative tasks as assigned.
- **Voter Services Division**: Responsible for voter registration, front desk management, list maintenance, public records, voter card mailings, jurisdictional auditing, producing public data, and other administrative tasks as assigned.
