

RECYCLING IN DURHAM IS EASY!

AT THE CONVENIENCE SITES

Durham County operates and maintains three staffed convenience sites listed on the back of this brochure. Residents must display a current Solid Waste Decal in order to use these services. Solid Waste Decals are issued on a fiscal year basis and are included with your real estate tax bill which is mailed in late July/early August. To purchase a decal, contact the Durham County Tax Office at 919-560-0300.

These convenience sites are for unincorporated residential waste and recycling only. The sites DO NOT accept commercial waste or construction and demolition waste.

AT HOME

Durham County also provides curbside collection of recyclables for unincorporated residents every other week. Each home is issued one green 96 gallon recycling cart. For a current recycling schedule, download the free **Durham County Recycles** app or visit our website www.dconcc.gov/recycling. If your home does not have a recycling cart, call 919-560-0433 to request one.

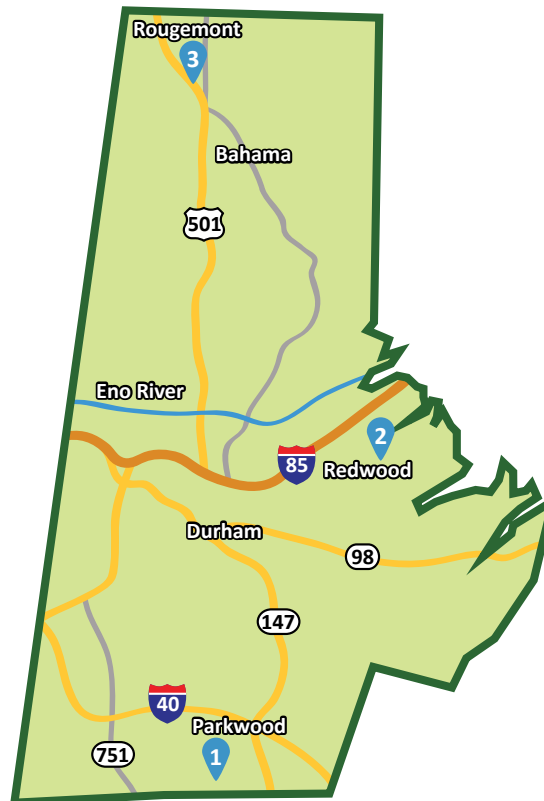

ALSO ACCEPTED

The following materials are also accepted for recycling and proper disposal at the Durham County convenience sites. NO business and commercial waste. For additional restrictions, see the site attendant. We do not accept TVs or computer monitors.



Used cooking oil



Fluorescent and CFL bulbs, 4 ft or less



Used motor oil and filters, car batteries and anti-freeze



Scrap metal and large appliances



Yard waste no larger than 6" in diameter or 6' in length



Bulky items: furniture, mattresses and large toys (limited to one dump per week)



Swap Shops are available at Site 2 and 3 for residents to leave and take gently used reusable items



Household trash
