6. August Anchor Award Winner? Deputy Donald Wadford

Deputy Donald Wadford, Levy Execution Officer for Tax Administration, was selected to receive the August Anchor Award. Deputy Wadford was recognized for this honor because of superior work, particularly for his major role as a part of the Collection Division team that obtained a record collection percentage of 98.23 % for Fiscal Year 2004-2005.

- Deputy Wadford has set a new standard for excellence by increasing Durham County?s overall
 collection rate by over .17 % from the previous year and the motor vehicle collection rate by .69
 %.
- The numbers listed above are impressive taking into account that Deputy Wadford was able to
 collect this revenue while having to seize only 12 vehicles. In the previous year, over 80 vehicles
 were seized during the same time.
