6. <u>Proclamation - National Foster Care Month 2013</u> (5 min)

- 1) All children deserve a safe, happy life including the 400,000 American children and youth in foster care. Young people in foster care especially need nurturing adults on their side because their own families are in crisis and unable to care for them. Each May, we salute the compassionate people who make a difference by serving as foster parents, relative caregivers, mentors, advocates, social workers, and volunteers. Thanks to these unsung heroes, many formerly abused or neglected children and teens will either safely reunite with their parents, be cared for by relatives, or be adopted by loving families.
- 2) Two major events will be held in May to commemorate Foster Care month:
 - Foster Parent Appreciation Celebration Friday, May 17, 2013, from 7:00 p.m. until 10:00 p.m. at the Ivy Community Center (Invitation Only).
 - Walk for the Children Saturday, May 18, 2013, from 10:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. The walk will start at the Durham County Department of Social Services parking lot, 300 block of East Main Street, across from the Durham Housing Authority. Walkers

will take East Main Street to the Farmers Market and surrounding areas and then return to the same parking lot. The public is invited to participate and asked wear white T-shirts and blue denim bottoms to promote visibility and cohesiveness.

7. Recognition of Budget and Management Services for Receiving the GFOA Distinguished Budget Presentation Award for the FY 2012-13 Budget (5 min)

- 1) The Board is requested to recognize the Department of Budget and Management Services for receiving the GFOA Distinguished Budget Presentation Award for the FY 2012-13 budget.
- 2) In order to receive the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award, the budget document had to satisfy nationally recognized guidelines for effective budget presentation. These guidelines are designed to assess how well an entity's budget serves as: a policy document, a financial plan, an operations guide, and a communications device. Budget documents must be rated "proficient" in all four categories to receive the award.
- 3) The award reflects a significant commitment by the Board of County Commissioners and staff to meet the highest principles of governmental budgeting. This is the 16th time the county has won the award, and the 9th consecutive year.
- 4) The Government Finance Officers Association is a nonprofit association serving over 17,500 government finance professionals throughout North America. The GFOA's Distinguished Budget Presentation Awards Program is the only national awards program in governmental budgeting.

8. Resolution Honoring Rev. Dr. Ednance Albert Roberts (5 min)

1) The Board has been asked to remember Rev. Dr. Ednance Albert Roberts, a former member and Chairman of the Durham County Library Board of Trustees who passed on April 7, 2013. Rev. Roberts served from June 2005 through October 2010. During his tenure, the Library went through an extensive building and renovation program to improve services.

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2) He is recalled fondly by Library staff and officials and known for his kindness and concern. In recent reflections, it was noted, "He remembered the names of our children and relatives and asked about them regularly. Then he actually listened to our answers. If he knew we were going through some personal difficulty, he always promised to keep us in his prayers....His love for the library and for people came through in every interaction."

9. Recognition for Emergency Management Coordinator Mark Schell (5 min)

- 1) Durham County Emergency Management Coordinator Mark Schell was awarded the Durham Police Department's Community Service Medal at a ceremony held May 9th at City Hall Council Chambers.
- 2) The coveted award is based on his efforts with the Biological and Chemical Emergency Response Team or BCERT. In the award letter from Durham Police Chief Jose L. Lopez, Sr., he said of Mark, "Your involvement and collaboration with the Durham Police Department BCERT team has benefited the community by ensuring that Durham acquires the necessary training, technology and funding necessary to properly respond to critical incidents. Your continued advocacy demonstrates your commitment to the BCERT program and the community."
