# 5. Recognition of Tammy Baggett Receiving the 2013 Roadbuilders Award from the NCLA Round Table for Ethnic Minority Concerns (5 min)

- 1) The Board is requested to recognize Tammy Baggett, Durham County Library Director, for receiving the 2013 Roadbuilders Award for Public Librarianship from the North Carolina Library Association Round Table for Ethnic Minority Concerns.
- 2) The Roadbuilders Award recognizes ethnic minority librarians in library education, academic, public, school and special libraries, who have served as pioneers in librarianship and who represent a positive role model in the field. The award also recognizes ethnic minority librarians who exemplify courage, integrity, perseverance and who have contributed to the field of librarianship. Baggett received the award at the 60<sup>th</sup> NCLA Biennial Conference in Winston-Salem October 17.

#### 7. Required Public Hearing for CDBG Funds Application to State (15 min)

- 1) The Board is requested to hold an additional public hearing prior to applying to the North Carolina Department of Commerce for Small Cities Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds.
- 2) Other public hearings for this grant were held on August 13<sup>th</sup>, 2012, and Sept. 24<sup>th</sup>, 2012. The first public hearing was to explain the funding categories of the 2012 CDBG Program and to allow the citizens of the County an opportunity to express their views concerning community development needs and priorities. The purpose of the second public hearing as well as this one is to explain the Infrastructure Contingency application Durham County has submitted (to help fund a solution to the Rougemont groundwater pollution problem) and to allow the citizens of the County an opportunity to express their views concerning community development needs and priorities.

<u>County Manager's Recommendation</u>: The County Manager recommends that the Board hold this required public hearing and consider any input received.

## 8. <u>Public Hearing to Consider Allocating Economic Development Investment Funds to AW North Carolina</u> (15 min)

1) The Board is requested to hold a public hearing to consider allocating \$900,000.00 in economic development investment funds to AW North Carolina, (AW), a world class leading manufacturer of high-quality automatic transmissions and transmission components, including torque converters, oil pumps, clutch assemblies and stamped parts as well as fully assembled automatic transmissions. AW North Carolina, the state's largest Japanese-owned manufacturing operation, is a subsidiary of Aisin AW Co., Ltd., a major automatic transmission manufacturer in the world market located in Anjo City, Japan. AW North Carolina is Aisin AW's first manufacturing facility built outside of Japan, AW North Carolina was established in Durham in November 1998. The company produces fully assembled automatic transmissions for Toyota Motor Corporation, including the Tundra, Sequoia, Tacoma, Camry and other vehicles. Promoting a strong, team-based, multi-cultural environment, AW North Carolina

currently employs approximately 1600 full-time employees at its Durham facility. Worldwide, the company has over 20,000 employees.

- AW is looking to expand its operations by adding additional manufacturing machinery and equipment to its existing 820,000 square foot facility in Treyburn Corporate Park. The company proposes a capital investment of \$112M to do so. This investment will yield considerable new tax revenue to the County. Moreover, it will create 56 new full-time machine operator jobs at the Durham facility. Durham is competing with two other sites in North Carolina and alternative sites in Georgia, Tennessee and Mexico. These communities have been aggressive in recruiting projects possessing the quality and magnitude of AW's expansion as AW is considered a prized company. Incentives are a key consideration in the company's decision of where it will expand its manufacturing capacity.
- 3) AW believes that being an integral part of the community environment is critical to its success and the company is committed to corporate citizenship and civic involvement. The company has been proactive in addressing community issues and improving the quality of life. AW values the environment inside and outside of its manufacturing facility as the company believes pleasant working and living environments offer a positive contribution to the lives of its employees and the company. The company has been a supporter of Durham County's education system and community organizations and has provided financial support to Durham Public Schools, Durham Technical Community College, the Museum of Life & Sciences and the Bahama Volunteer Fire District. AW believes that its relationship with local organizations and the community adds to the quality of the company, its team members, its products and its distinction as a good corporate neighbor.
